Reminder:

Required Vaccinations

Some students may be due for their 2nd meningitis B or other required vaccinations within the next few weeks. Students will be emailed reminders. If you have already received the vaccines, email the documentation to wellnesscenter@nec.edu. Those who are 18 years old or younger may get their vaccines at the Wellness Center for free. For 19 and older, there will be a vaccine clinic on campus the first week of March. More details to come.

Emergency Text Messaging Service

New England College uses a text messaging service contact community members in the event of an emergency on campus. This service, hosted through a company named Omnilert, also allows you to have messages sent to you in the event of a school cancellation (e.g. snow-related closings) or parking lot closings (for snow removal).

Sign-up for this service is free (standard text messaging rates would apply for each message), and students can have a second phone number linked to their account.

How To Sign Up For the NEC Emergency Text Messaging Service:

Students go to the following website: <u>nec.omnilert.net/subscriber.php</u> and create an account. If your students wants to enter a second cell phone number (for instance, if you would want to get these messages as well), they can add a second phone number.

Updates from Res Life

ResLife is glad to have your student back for the Spring 2025 semester! Despite a snowy semester so far, we are excited about what this semester brings, especially as we look ahead and begin planning for the 2025-2026 Academic Year (Yes, already!). For any students who may be interested in applying, RA applications are available now and are due on February 21st. ResLife staff will also be holding several RA info sessions for those interested in learning more about the position.

Please also save the date for the 2025-2026 Housing Selection process, which returning students will participate in between March 28th and April 8th. As a reminder for families, NEC has a three-year on-campus residency requirement, which means that all undergraduate students are required to live on campus for their first 3 years (or six semesters) unless they meet one or more of the established eligibility criteria. We highly recommend all students confirm their eligibility before signing any lease off campus! Students can look for more information about housing selection and the on-campus requirement in their NEC email or by stopping by the ResLife office during business hours.

1098-T Tuition Statements for Taxes Available in MyNEC and Were Mailed

The 1098-T form helps eligible students figure out if they can claim an education tax credit on their tax return. However, just receiving the form doesn't mean you're automatically eligible for a tax credit. Whether you're eligible depends on factors like your income, enrollment status (full-time or half-time), and the amount of qualified educational expenses you had during the year. To learn more about claiming education tax credits, check out IRS Publication 970.

Students can find their 1098-T form online in MyNEC and a copy has been mailed. To view the form in MyNEC, students may click on 'Student Services & Financial Aid', then 'Student Records', 'Tax Notification', and select '2024'.

New England College prepares these forms according to IRS rules, but we can't give tax advice. For more help, please consult a qualified tax professional or visit the IRS website at irs.gov.

Mentoring Program Tips


